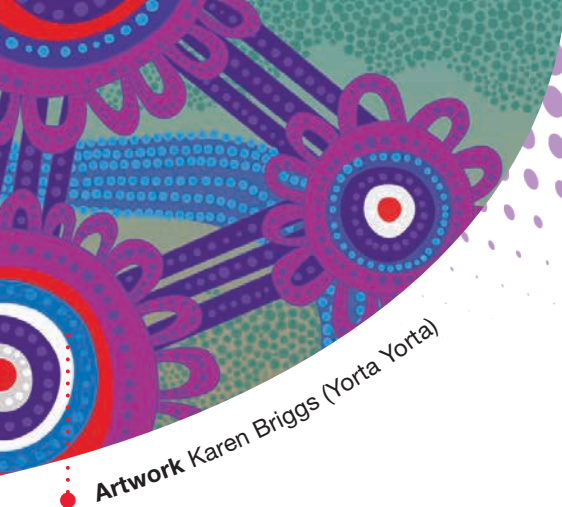
In June 2021, coinciding with National Reconciliation Week, we were proud to launch our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). This plan is a framework for cultural change that affirms our commitment to reconciliation by building greater awareness and providing increased opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander staff and students.

If you identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student, you'll have access to TAFE SA's Aboriginal Access Centre throughout your study. The Aboriginal Access Centre delivers a variety of programs in metropolitan, regional, and remote areas, and helps with enrolments into TAFE SA courses. The centre also offers mentoring by training support officers, who act as a link between you and your lecturers and assist you in developing your individualised learning plan. Since the early 1980s, TAFE SA has had a presence in the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara (APY) Lands, providing key support and training services for local communities. Currently, we have six learning sites in the APY Lands that offer work readiness and skills. 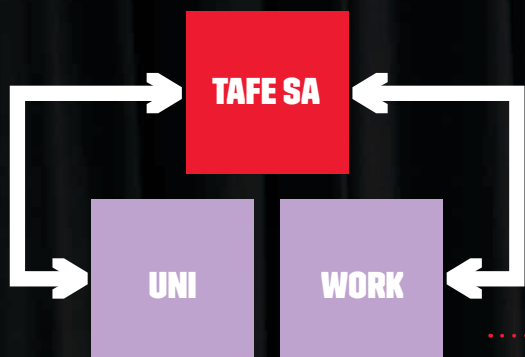

With learning sites across metropolitan and regional South Australia, we're the biggest provider of vocational training in the state. Learn hands-on from expert lecturers in our state-of-the-art facilities and gain access to the latest learning technologies.

## ONLINE

Study online and let study fit in with your lifestyle. Many TAFE SA qualifications offer the option to complete some or all of your study online. ## VIRTUAL CLASSROOMS

Some classes are delivered via a web-based tool that acts as a real-time virtual classroom. Students and lecturer interact over the internet. Software does not need to be installed, and students can access the classroom from any computer or mobile telephone that has an internet connection.

Many courses are available to study part-time, which allows you to fit in study around your lifestyle and work commitments.

## APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS

If you can't wait to get a job, studying a TAFE SA qualification via an apprenticeship or traineeship is a great option to earn money while you learn.

**Gain nationally recognised qualifications while completing your South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).**

## **FLEXIBLE INDUSTRY PATHWAY PROGRAMS**


The South Australian Government's Flexible Industry Pathways program is available for students turning 16 years or older and enrolled in Year 11 or Year 12. Students study with TAFE SA while undertaking their SACE, and graduate with a nationally recognised qualification from certificate II to certificate III level, in one of South Australia's growth industries.

## **SPECIALISED COURSES FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS (STACKABLE VET)**

TAFE SA provides accredited courses tailored for high school students in Year 10, Year 11, and Year 12. These courses are integral to the South Australian Government's Stackable VET program, equipping students with valuable vocational skills, preparing them for the workforce, and offering opportunities to explore various fields before making definitive career choices. Stackable VET courses may also contribute credits towards a student's SACE.

## **SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS**

Secondary school students can begin an apprenticeship or traineeship in Years 10, 11 or 12, combining paid employment and structured work-related training as part of their SACE. This allows students to earn while they learn, and graduate with on-the-job training and skills.

Want guaranteed entry to university? With dual offer courses, you are accepted into both a TAFE SA diploma, advanced diploma or associate degree and a connected university program. This means that once you complete your TAFE SA course successfully, you have guaranteed entry – with credit – into university.

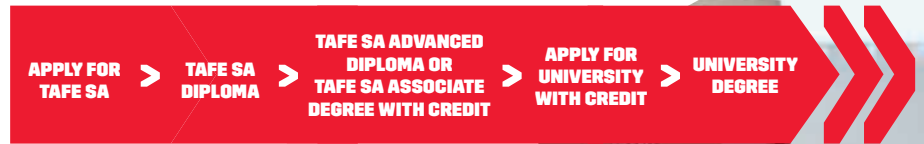
## CREDIT TRANSFER

TAFE SA has many credit transfer agreements with universities for TAFE SA graduates. These can provide some advanced standing in university courses if you wish to undertake further education.

Credit transfer recognises the parts of a TAFE SA qualification that are equivalent in content and level to parts of some university programs.

To claim credit, you must formally apply to the university in accordance with their processes and you may need to show evidence of your previous studies, such as your qualification parchment.

Being eligible for credit does not guarantee that you will be offered a place in the university program. Credit will normally only be granted after you have been offered a place.



## UNIVERSITY TO TAFE SA

Many university students also undertake TAFE SA qualifications to increase their employability by gaining industry-specific practical skills.

**TAFE SA's Aboriginal Access Centre delivers an innovative range of programs to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people across South Australia, including in regional and remote locations. The centre can help with enrolment into other TAFE SA qualifications.**

## **STUDENT SUPPORT**

Training support officers are available for students to offer support with individual learning plans to map pathways to higher education or employment. A training support officer will also work closely with lecturers to ensure you have the support you need.

## **THE ABORIGINAL TUTORIAL ASSISTANCE SCHEME (ATAS)**

Free tutoring assistance is available by ATAS to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who are enrolled in TAFE SA courses or training programs at certificate III level qualifications or higher. Eligible full-time students have access to up to 2 hours tutoring per week, for up to 34 weeks.

## VIRTUAL SHIP ENGINE ROOM

## ADELAIDE COLLEGE OF THE ARTS

Purpose-designed to achieve excellence in arts training, the Adelaide College of the Arts is where students can live and breathe their passion for arts and design. At every turn you'll find highly specialised spaces to hone your talents and develop practical skills – from film and TV, computer-generated imagery (CGI) and visual effects (VFX), digital media, and sound and technical production, to acting, dance, visual arts, fashion, and photography.

## TONSLEY

TAFE SA's Tonsley campus provides nearly 45,000m<sup>2</sup> of world-class, energy-efficient, trade training infrastructure for the South Australian building and construction industry. Tonsley brings together all the building trades under one roof, enabling you to learn and work together with other trades, just like you would on a real work site.

## REGENCY INTERNATIONAL CENTRE

Immerse yourself in the world of cookery, hospitality, bakery, butchery, and food processing at the Regency International Centre. Boasting a state-of-the-art brewery, cheese making facility, coffee academy, wine sensory rooms, training bars and restaurants, commercial kitchens and bakeries, students learn in-situ gaining real hands-on experience.

## CENTRE FOR DENTAL STUDIES

The Centre for Dental Studies is a 36-station dental laboratory which includes CAD-CAM technology, and a 28-chair dental clinic with a demonstration area that utilises intraoral and extraoral cameras.

## MINING, ENGINEERING AND TRANSPORT CENTRE

This purpose-built training facility supports the growth in the mining, civil and mechanical engineering, advanced manufacturing, transport, and defence industries. Facilities include high-bay workshops, practice drill rig and drill pad, land information systems survey equipment and computer software, CAD suite, advanced manufacturing 3D scanning and printing facilities, CNC mills, guillotines, and plasma cutters.

## ADVANCED WELDER TRAINING CENTRE

Learn in a simulated environment at TAFE SA's Advanced Welder Training Centre. With our welding simulators local welders will be ready to respond to the increased demand for their skills in advanced manufacturing as part of the naval shipbuilding program.



## CAMPUS BREWERY

TAFE SA's Campus Brewery, which is built to industry standards, comprises a state of the art micro-brewery, automated bottling machine and associated plant and laboratories. The core brewery comprises:

- > 600 litre versatile brewhouse
- > 2 x 600 litre fermenters
- > 2 x 1,200 litre fermenters
- > 3,000 bottle/hour automated bottling line

With steam heated mash mixer, decoction capability, reverse osmosis water treatment and accurate controls, this brewhouse is capable of producing wort from ancient, novel or experimental ingredients such as barley, wheat, rice, millet, rye, oats and even vegetables! It is possible to adopt a simple, craft-brew mash approach or simulate large scale brewhouses with our true lauter tun, with high reproducibility and efficiency. Our four fermenters enable the brewery to have four different brews fermenting at the same time, with an annual capacity of 90,000 litres. Our packaging line includes a three head rotary labeller for front, neck and back labels, and a mono-bloc isobaric filling machine comprising 12 heads rinse, 12 heads double pre-evacuation counter-pressure filling and crown sealing.

## VETERINARY AND APPLIED SCIENCE CENTRE

The Veterinary and Applied Science Centre is one of the largest purpose-built applied science and animal industries training facilities in Australia. It includes a fully functioning veterinary clinic with surgery and radiology suite, a pathology demonstration theatre with CCTV monitors, and facilities for animal holding and grooming.

## TRAINING AND SECURITY OPERATIONS CENTRE

Learn how to prevent cyber-security attacks at TAFE SA's Training Security Operations Centre (TSOC). The facility provides hands-on simulated training for highly sought-after cyber security professionals to help stem the worldwide growth of malicious cyber activity.

TSOC is the first of its kind in the state's VET sector with a red 'attack' room and a blue 'defence' room that mirror real-life scenarios, simulations, testing opportunities and interaction with other TSOCs across the country. It also features the latest hardware and software from a variety of industry partners including CISCO, Microsoft, Fortinet, Splunk, IBM, HP, Aruba, VMWare, AWS, and Palo Alto.

# FUTURE PROOF. FUTURE READY.

**South Australia is on a mission to be a leader in emerging and tech driven industries with state priority sectors including space, green energy, and defence (naval shipbuilding). These industries have a growing need for employees with specialised skills. Train with TAFE SA and prepare to get a job of the future, now.**

## SPACE

The Australian Space Agency, the Australian Space Discovery Centre, the Responsive Space Operations Centre, and over 100 space-related companies are all located in SA. This space industry growth has created potential career opportunities that could see you designing and manufacturing small satellites, or developing components, instrumentation, and sensors.

## CLEAN HYDROGEN

The South Australian government is strategically investing in key hydrogen and infrastructure projects to position South Australia as the global producer and supplier of green hydrogen/clean energy. There are also plans to construct a world-leading green hydrogen power station, electrolyser and storage facility near Whyalla by the end of 2025 which will create many jobs in this emerging sector.

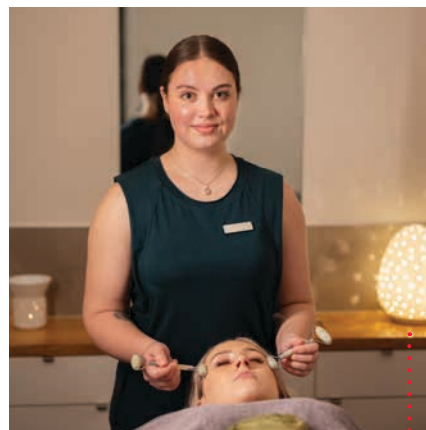
